Mr. Morris advised he had an envelope taped to his door the other night, and it is not signed by anybody. Mr. Morris read the letter, and a copy of the letter is attached. Mr. Morris said he thought someone had made a comment on social media that was relevant to this as to somebody being harassed, and after reading the Minutes, he did not think Mrs. Bartone said anything about harassment, it was just a statement. Mrs. Bartone said she was not on Facebook and did not see the statement. Mr. Morris said he did not see the statement either.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

Mayor & Safety Director – Mr. Eva

Mayor Eva advised the annual Santa's Blue Helpers shopping trip will be held on Sunday, December 19, 2021, starting at 5:00 P.M. in the Community Room. Officer Tina Messinger has received donations from Marco's Pizza and Spuddy's Tavern for the event. They have sixteen students from Lake Elementary, and volunteers are needed for the shopping at Target.

Ptl. Ken Wuchte is retiring from the Police Department effective December 31, 2021. He has been working for the City for the last 34 years. His last working shift is Christmas Day, and Mayor Eva wished him the best.

Mayor Eva congratulated Mr. Wolk for serving on Council the last eight years, as this is his last meeting, and thanked him. Mr. Wolk served on the Parks and Recreation Board before he was elected to Council. Mayor Eva also thanked him for his help with tutoring at Lake Elementary. Mayor Eva wished Mr. Wolk and his family all the best going forward. Mr. Wolk thanked Mayor Eva.

The Civil Service Commission met tonight. They will give a full-time police officer exam on Thursday, February 24, 2022, from 6:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M.

Mayor Eva read the Fire Department Report for November 2021. For the month of November 2021 there was a total of 118 calls for service as follows: Rescue/EMS – 66 calls, none of which required the use of Narcan; Fire/Service – 22 calls; and Invalid Assist – 30 calls. In the month of November, F.F. Campaign and F.F. Corbe completed the Blue Card Command training program. This training consists of 50 online hours of study followed by 25 hours of hands-on experience. The Blue Card Command System is the fire industry's standard for Incident Command and is utilized throughout Lake County. Lt. Konte, Lt. Langford, and F.F. Sedmak are scheduled to complete the course in December.

Administrative Director – Mrs. Bartone

Mrs. Bartone pointed out a couple of items on tonight's Agenda. Regarding Resolution No. 2021-R-38, the City's current labor relations management specialist, who has been with the City since 1986, retired a couple of months ago. She did some research, and the legislation on tonight's Agenda is for Stefanik Iosue & Associates LLC. They will not be on a normal retainer but will be paid hourly. Currently the City does not have anyone on retainer, and she would appreciate it if Council would consider passing this tonight. Ordinance No. 2021-O-31 is to temporarily appropriate money for the City to continue operating until the final budget is passed. Ordinance No. 2021-O-33 is for a couple of adjustments to the General Fund and to cover some expenses; two were for grants received during the year; and the Fire Levy, funds were moved from operations to personnel.

Law Director – Mr. Lyons

Mr. Lyons wished everyone a Merry Christmas. He thanked Mr. Wolk for serving the last eight years; he had a lot of good questions and had a lot of good ideas, and he appreciates the opportunity of working with him. Mr. Wolk thanked Mr. Lyons.

Mr. Morris asked Mrs. Bartone if she had an update on the audit. Mrs. Bartone said nothing official. The interim middle people who conducted the audit submitted their response to the State. They feel it should be ok.

At any point in time there could be a grievance filed; at any point in time an issue could arise; full-time fire is coming up and she would feel better having them review all of the contracts going into next year. Mr. Wolk said he would also recommend to all Members of Council that some information needs to be sent out about them so independent research can be done to make sure Council wants to bring them on board. Mr. Morris that is kind of what he is thinking. Mrs. Thompson asked if they represent any other cities. Mr. Lyons said he did not necessarily know them, but they represent Painesville Township. Mrs. Bartone added the Sheriff's Department, City of Eastlake, University Heights, Hudson, Painesville Township, North Olmsted, to name a few. Mr. Wolk asked if she thinks this is going to be more costly or less costly than previous years. Mrs. Bartone said even with Tom Grabarczyk it was fluid because we went years without needing him but he was on the payroll. Some years we went over his minimum retainer and had to pay him the difference, some years we went under. It will be more hourly, but Tom has not raised his rates for some years, and she anticipates the first two years to be more expensive and then it will taper off.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mrs. Bartone asked if Council had had a chance to review the information on the CRA application she had sent them. Mrs. Thompson asked if everyone had gotten a chance to review the information on Hickory, and asked for comments on proceeding with that application. Mr. Morris was not sure what the problem was, it seemed he was asking for the balance of the CRA if he still applies. Mrs. Bartone said

he was asking for the abatement in full as the house was completed in 2019. New construction is fifteen years; he was told it was ten years. She cannot confirm what was said in the listing as the listing has been updated. He does not have anything specifically in writing. Mrs. Thompson asked if this is the one who thought he automatically got it without filing the application. Mrs. Bartone said yes, he was sold the house under the assumption, so he would like the remainder of the ten years. Discussion was held, including the intention and rules of the CRA Ordinance, and the abatement in this particular matter. Mr. Wolk said he would recommend sending this to Committee to see where this fits in with the language of the CRA and make a determination. Mrs. Thompson stated this will be referred to the Community Development Committee, including whether the old Ordinance or the amended Ordinance applies.

NEW BUSINESS: (None)

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC TO SPEAK: 7:42 P.M.

Skip Gray, 7574 Dahlia. Mr. Gray asked a question about the Opioid legislation and whether the City would be reimbursed for monies spent for Narcan. Mr. Lyons said any money from the State is supposed to be used to alleviate the opioid problem. He thought that most of the Narcan was supplied by the Health Department. Mayor Eva said that was correct. Mr. Lyons said there is some significant money that will be paid if this is passed by enough municipalities. Mr. Gray asked if special training for EMS was included in the use of Narcan. Mayor Eva stated they have all had training.
